

Work from Home

1. I do not recommend doing a Google search of "work from home jobs" or similar search terms. This generally yields scams.
2. I do recommend doing a Google search on any company you find on a credible site. Scam companies advertise on these sites as well. I've found that if it is a scam it's within the first 5-7 hits on Google.
3. Do not pay any fees. A legitimate company will not charge you to work for them.
4. Do not believe offers of \$45/hour or any large amount within the first week.
5. There is a very popular scam that claims to have been featured on various credible news outlets. It claims to make you hundreds of dollars in the first week. Don't believe it
